

Attachment E: Sample Case Studies

HHS-RFP-2022-17: Severe Weather Emergency Shelter Services

Please note, these hypothetical case studies are included simply to illustrate the **broad range of shelter options** which could satisfy this RFP. Other options are happily welcomed and could be strong proposals.

Case study #1: An organization in Marin with a large space suitable for congregate shelter partners with an organization with homelessness service experience and strong relationships with the community

Case study #2: An organization with strong experience serving people with disabilities partners with an organization with homelessness service experience to procure hotel rooms for non-congregate shelter and support during the severe weather emergency

Case study #3: An organization with strong homelessness experience organizes sites in different regions of Marin (sites could be congregate and/or non-congregate) to provide shelter and support during the severe weather emergency

Case study #4: A small organization with deep experience/trust among people who are Black, Indigenous, and/or People of Color partners with a larger organization with strong behavioral health clinical skills who has strong homelessness experience in Marin to provide 25 beds in a congregate setting

Case study #5: A small organization with experience working with people who don't speak English as their primary language procures a site to provide 12 beds in a congregate setting

Case study #6: A spiritual-based organization with strong homelessness experience uses their own buildings/retreat center/staff housing to provide non-congregate shelter for up to 10 families and their pets
